**TBBS Spring 2018 Course Descriptions**

<b>BI 304.3</b> <b>OT 615.3</b>	<b>Historical Books I</b> An analysis and exposition of the Historical Books of Joshua - 1 Kings, emphasizing their history and theology, and including an overview of Historical Books II.
<b>BI 403.3</b> <b>NT 620.3</b>	<b>Daniel and Revelation</b> An exposition of Revelation and related parts of Daniel showing their relationship to history and prophecy.
<b>BL 202.3</b> <b>BL 510.3</b>	<b>Elementary Greek II</b> A continued study of the basics of Biblical Greek progressing into actual exegesis of simple texts.
<b>BL 302.3</b> <b>BL 512.3</b>	<b>Greek Exegesis II</b> A continued study of the principles and introduction to the methods of Greek from the book of Matthew.
<b>BL 409.3</b> <b>BL 521.3</b>	<b>Elementary Hebrew II</b> A continued study of elementary Hebrew and an introduction to Hebrew exegesis focused on development of an ancient Hebrew mindset using narrative and poetic texts of Genesis.
<b>BC 101.3</b> <b>BC 601.3</b>	<b>Introduction to Biblical Counseling</b> An introduction and overview of pastoral care in the local church ministry including personal soul winning, individual discipleship for new converts, and restorative counseling for erring believers.
<b>BC 102.3</b> <b>BC 510.3</b>	<b>Principles for Christian Living</b> A study of the discipleship principles necessary to develop and maintain a mature Christian philosophy covering every aspect of life.
<b>BC 214.2</b> <b>BC 614.2</b>	<b>Womanhood</b> Feminine versus feminist. God's plan for the woman's role in society. Womanhood will be studied as a specific design by God to fulfill a specific position and role in His economy. A biblical basis will be developed to study a woman's true identity as God intended for her. Specific portions of Scripture will be expounded.
<b>BC 401.3</b> <b>BC 501.3</b>	<b>Counseling Tools</b> An introduction to biblical counseling with hands-on experience. The student will complete research projects, Bible studies, examine counseling resources, and develop a counseling format for solving common problems.
<b>BC 413.3</b> <b>BC 513.3</b>	<b>Applications of Biblical Counseling</b> A course giving opportunities to observe Biblical counseling in progress. Case studies, Bible studies, and organizing a counseling plan with necessary counseling resources for solving common problems from the Scriptures will be implemented.
<b>BC 425.3</b> <b>BC 525.3</b>	<b>Biblical Counseling Certification Preparation</b> Preparation for ACBC certification.
<b>BI 321.3</b> <b>OT 621.3</b>	<b>Job-Song of Solomon and Hebrew Parallelism</b> A study of the theme, outline, content, and theology of the books of Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Solomon with an emphasis on the necessity of accurate interpretation of ancient Hebrew parallelism.
<b>BI 442.3</b> <b>TH 716.3</b>	<b>Biblical Theology NT / NT Theology</b> An analytical study building on truths established in Biblical Theology OT and designed to further develop an accurate understanding of the unchanging person and nature of God as He revealed Himself in His Son and the NT Scriptures, demonstrating and demanding total consistency in all revelation of all times and kinds.
